Public Input:

• Duane Gallt and Steve Cornaire spoke on an issue with Social Security not being reported for town employees. The bookkeeper, Ms. Hillier will check into this again, as this needs to be taken care of.

Public Hearing

• The public hearing was opened at 6:15pm for the preliminary budget for 2020.

Reports:

Code Enforcement Officer:

- Two new permits were issued for a Route 10 driveway and a shed on School Street. A permit for a start of a new house on Grey Road was updated. There is new construction on a home on Route 29. The work on the New Turnpike barn and shed has been completed. Renewals/inspections for Hatch and Saltsman Road will be done at a convenient time for both parties. An add on for a house on Rte 119 is done. The Rockwood house demo is completed and changes have been made. Two properties on 119 have acknowledged violations and are working to correct the issues.
- Mr. Percival reported that the New Construction Program has been completed and the data has been uploaded to US Census.

Planning Board:

- The next meeting will be held on December 9th, 2019 at 6pm (the Monday before the Town Board meeting).
- A workshop on reverse mortgages will be held December 6^{th} at the town hall.

Highway:

- Superintendent Alan Cretser reported that all the trucks have been serviced.
- They are looking into the extended warranties offered on the wheeled excavator.

Youth:

- The sponsor dinner was not well attended, and they are planning for the car show.
- Bags are being put on mailboxes for donations for the elderly people through the Scouts at the ERC. They will be picked up on November 16th.

Assessor:

- Data collection is being completed on properties with structural changes in the form of additions, new buildings and/or demolitions. Parcels have been found where construction has been done with no permits. The assessor's office will be giving the Code Enforcer a list of those found.
- While doing data collection, they also noticed an alarming amount of blight in the town, and some living conditions that need to be addressed further.
- Renewals for senior exemptions have been run and will be sent out next week. Ag Value renewals have also been done and will also be sent out. Anyone who needs a new Star B must enroll with the state and anyone who is changing from a Basic Star to an Enhanced Star needs to be enrolled here before March 1, 2020. WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Ephratah, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of the Town to adopt said Local Law adopting said Fulton County Local Law 3 of 2019,

Opting Out of Section 487 NYS Real Property Tax Law Exemptions for Solar Energy System, Wind Energy System and Farm Waste Energy System Projects

Local Law Number 2 of 2019

Section 1. The purpose of this local law is to opt out of Real Property Tax Law § 487 to capture revenues from the development of solar energy facilities and to ensure that such facilities are treated equally with other commercial properties within the Town.

Section 2.

- A. No exemption under Real Property Tax Law § 487 shall be applicable to the Town of Ephratah taxes with respect to any solar or wind energy system or farm waste energy system.
- B. No exemption under Real Property Tax Law § 487 shall be applicable to the Town of Ephratah taxes with respect to any micro-hydroelectric energy system, fuel electric generating system, micro-combined heat and power generating equipment system, or electric energy storage equipment or electric energy storage system.

Section 3.

The invalidity or unenforceability of any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or phrase of the aforementioned sections, as declared by the valid judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or phrase, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4.

To the extent that this local law is inconsistent with Real Property Tax Law § 487 it shall supersede those laws.

Section 5.

- A. This law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
- B. In accordance with RPTL 487 (8) a., the Town of Ephratah shall file this local law with the Commissioner of the New York State Department of Tax and Finance and with the president of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority.
